# **Serving Our Neighbors (SON) Ministries**

A message from our Executive Director

e are passionate about doing all we can to support children and families in the suburban setting as they take steps OUT of poverty. We are responding to God's call on my life March 3, 2007 to love, feed and serve the children facing poverty in my suburban town (where one in four children is facing poverty) and mobilize the community to Serve Our Neighbor. Next, we are responding directly to the needs that the children and families we are called by God to serve, are sharing with us: helping move people toward what the women, parents and even the children we serve have literally said would help them the most each time we ask: work/jobs.

Poverty is moving to the first ring suburbs across the U.S.A. One in four children in the Hilliard School district is facing poverty; one in five in Dublin and nearly one in three in Worthington and Westerville. God calls us to love and serve the poor. Studies show that "A child raised in a poor household has more than a 1 in 3 chance of spending the rest of their life living in poverty." According to a recent Columbus Dispatch article. This is our motivation. This is what we want to break. We are providing ladders to help children and their families escape poverty.

God is showing us that all He has built at SON Ministries, in the first five years, has been a structural foundation to support helping people move toward meaningful and lasting employment: JOBS. Helping children as they grow (with enough healthy food, with tutoring and homework help) and their parents (with English, Job Readiness, Legal Advice) are all to support finding employment that will allow families to be stabilized and dreams to be fulfilled. We believe education and

connecting adults to meaningful work is the best way to empower them to break the cycle of poverty families. We have seen it to be true repeatedly. We have responded to learning that preschool for disadvantaged children today is workforce development for 20 years from now. Thus far, SON Ministries has made strong efforts in helping adults and children toward fulfilling their employment potential now and in the future in three significant ways: Adult Job Readiness training, multiplication of Taco Bell Jr. (see inside story highlighting our 10th summer), Early Learning for preschool aged children at our Family ESL program.

We believe: people get work done but work also gets people done. When we work, we use our God-given passions, gifts and talents to make a difference in this world, in our community, our schools and our homes. Working and serving God is truly a blessing. Our jobs are a large part of who we are and how we express who God created us to be. We are working toward a Social Enterprise – a for profit company that will employ teens and adults we serve who otherwise might have barriers to work as well as help to fund the work of SON Ministries.

#### **New This Year**

A structured time of prayer with staff and community members "Pray for Hilliard" every Tuesday 9am-9:30am. We lift the entire community in prayer asking God to protect, bless and be glorified.

Our *Community Education* surged due to the increase in requests for us to facilitate Poverty Simulations, by suburban school districts and community groups. The Poverty Simulation is a unique, enlightening half day experience that helps individuals begin to understand

what life is like with a shortage of money and an abundance of stress. It moves people to think about the harsh realities of poverty and to talk about how communities can address the problem collectively with a Hand Up, full of respect. Most importantly, it encourages people to make a difference.

We are humbled to serve the children and families God brings us from 41 countries. My friend Aaron Starr shared with me a realization he had this year: children facing poverty are tough, adaptable, rough around the edges, will go anywhere and have strong survival skills. All together creating a unique skillset that God could use to send to the ends of the earth to proclaim Him. I agree! We want children to learn how much God loves them and we are showing His love tangibly through the relationships we build at the effective programs we offer through this ministry.

Join this exciting community building movement – as an individual, a church, a business, a civic association – together we are Serving Our Neighbors by helping our neighbors fulfill their dreams of meaningful and lasting employment – all to the glory of God.

# Consults and partners with organizations to respond to community needs:

New School Shoes: each child who attended our summer program received a new pair of shoes of their color/style choice and size to start off their school year. Partnership with Cypress Church. (NEW 2016)

Free Water Safety/Swim Lessons for low-income children. Partnership with Hilliard Parks & Rec. (Since 2015)

Back to School Supply Store: coached a church partner in the "dignity store" model of responding to community needs. Low-income families shop for new school supplies at dramatically reduced prices. Partnership with Hilliard Presbyterian Church. (Since 2015)

### Family ESL Program

(Since 2008)

A school year length, full family educational program to help break the cycle of poverty.

Early Childhood: infants and preschool aged children are cared for and receive elements of early literacy and kindergarten readiness preparation.

Kids Club: school-aged children receive academic support, recreational programming and healthy snacks. **NEW:** community partners, "Snack Angels", help us provide substantial nutritious snacks or light meals to hungry children nightly.

<u>Teen Internship Program:</u> teens from diverse socioeconomic, cultural and religious backgrounds

receive training, leadership opportunities in a four week volunteer term as they develop a lifelong commitment to Serving Our Neighbor.

> Adult ESL (English as a Second Language) Classes: adults study English and improve their employability and income security. NEW:

Parents as Educators: invited professional educator to coach parents on how to work with their children at home over the summer to minimize summer learning loss and develop a lifelong love of learning and reading. Job Readiness (Since 2013): adults learn valuable skills critical to finding meaningful employment including resume building and interview practice in partnership with The Salvation Army.

### **Community Education**

Teaching organizations, businesses, churches, individuals and schools:

Poverty Simulations: for groups of 47-100 people, to uncover the challenges of poverty, break down barriers, generate a compassionate response to community action.

The Community Development model: working to help children and families take steps out of poverty through partnerships, collaboration, a hand up and respect based efforts.

The SON Ministries model: of identifying and addressing needs in other suburban communities to reach more children and families facing the unique challenges of suburban poverty.

Community building through volunteer recruiting and coaching: of 569 people dedicating 16,495 service hours to Serve Our Neighbor building a compassionate community where all gifts and talents are utilized and community is built and all are transformed.

Teens in Service Training Class: training young people to connect to meaningful service and to begin to develop a life-long commitment to Serving Our Neighbor.

chool year 2015-2016 as we prayed seeking God's will about our priorities for summer lunch 2016:

- · First we knew we would FEED the children, hunger is real in suburban poverty and we needed to start there as we had for nine years.
- Second we knew we wanted to pour LOVE into the children, believe in them, pray with them, DREAM with them.
- · Third we asked ... if we were so blessed with time with nearly 1,000 children created in the image of God, who are also facing poverty, what would the third thing be that we would do this summer?

We all agreed the BEST programming activity SON Ministries has done at the Hilliard Free Lunch Summer Camp for Kids was "Taco Bell Jr." as this teaches children how to dream BIG, work hard and run their own business. We pray it is helping them escape a life of poverty. Praying I felt God saying "flip it". So we got an AMBITIOUS vision: what if we flipped our summer camp into a Business Entrepreneurial Summer Camp that taught children K-8th grade how to run their own business - replicated Taco Bell Jr. to multiple lunch sites - as well as fed the children a free lunch because they are facing poverty. It was ambitious but we agreed the children were worth it!

Next, we contacted Junior Achievement and asked them to partner with us so we could teach the children deeper business skills to help them run their business. We recruited six of our SON Ministries Champions who are themselves entrepreneurs. They were trained in the J.A. materials then came to our lunch sites for five weeks and taught the business material to the K-8th grade campers. We then invited Special Guest Entrepreneurs to come to camp to speak and tell their own stories of hard work, perseverance and resilience.

Three Taco Bell Jr. founders (now high schoolers) traveled to two lunch sites to teach and coach the children at those sites how to start, then run a restaurant. We recruited, trained and mobilized adult volunteer teams for "kitchen support". Cameron Mitchell Restaurants helped us launch one site that invented America's Best Cookout - including vegetables from the UALC Community Garden. They sent a chef to our site each week to teach and help the children in the kitchen. The third site invented HoRIZE'n Shine brunch restaurant featuring eggs and pancakes with mix ins. Each restaurant ran once a week for five weeks and the children worked and planned in preparation throughout the week. More than 225 members of the community came as customers to support the children: from the Hilliard Mayor, Children's Hunger Alliance board members, State Representatives, Columbus and Hilliard City Council members, Ohio Dairy Assoc. president, school district administrators, principals, teachers and many more!

The first week of camp, one of the Taco Bell Jr. founders (now in high school) shared with me that he was preparing to go to technical school to study culinary. That same day, coincidentally, I was set to meet two regional chefs from Cameron Mitchell Restaurants about helping us launch a second child invented/run restaurant. I introduced the three of them the following week (in the Taco Bell Jr. kitchen where this young man was cooking). The chefs promptly offered him a behind the scenes tour at three of their High Street restaurants saying they wanted to be sure he was sure that he would love the industry. The tour happened and the young man got to taste many delicious foods saying his favorite was the "lamb burger" at The Guild House. The young man shared that he felt so comfortable in the kitchens he toured and did see himself pursuing this career field. He announced that the chefs had offered him a job!

Our 10th summer was a turning point in vision for SON Ministries - the year we became more determined than ever, to pull out all the stops, to help remarkable children in our town escape poverty!

The children are learning work ethic, problem solving, conflict resolution and working as a team to accomplish something amazing! The community grows, as leaders see how the children (in poverty) can do great things when surrounded by adults who love them unconditionally through Jesus and encourage them to DREAM!

### The Tucker Family

Our Executive Director met this mom at our Friends and Family night at her daughter's lunch site a few weeks earlier. They connected as women, moms, neighbors. They talked about serving the community and their faith in God and His provision. The mom shared about how her family had moved to Columbus a brandnew city, transferred by her husband's company, only to be laid off. How they had struggled financially but how God had provided, just in time at each need. She shared how the summer lunch program had provided her family with much needed cucumbers and squash to take home (from the UALC Community Garden), school shoes and how the names of the staff "green shirts" and Teen Interns "orange shirts" had come to her family dinner table nightly as her daughters talked about their fun day at camp.

Most of all she shared how this summer camp helped her family feel "part of the community" as they went through a tough time.

# **Teen Interns: Developing Future Servants**

everal years ago, we noticed both the children in our summer lunch program aging (and still wanting to come to camp) and our volunteer teenagers wanting to volunteer beyond what their parent's vacation time would allow. We started a Teen Internship program. Teenagers who make a big commitment of days/hours to one of our programs (summer or school year) can apply to become a Teen Intern. They submit references, go through an interview and training. Some of these "orange shirts" served 100 hours in one summer, some over 450 hours in their high school career. God is powerfully at work in the teens lives through their service at SON Ministries, teaching us all to trust in Him.

#### One Teen Intern's story:

I'm an immigrant; I left my home, my language, and my (extended) family almost 10 years ago for Ohio. Our family spent most of our savings to resettle in another country, everything was unfamiliar, and I missed my grandmother. However, for a fearless 9-year-old me, it was more of an exciting adventure rather than a detrimental obstacle in life.

As the years passed, I started discovering my identity: I am a Christian, a feminist, an artist, and a scientist. Being an immigrant and struggling with finances was a part of my life story, but it wasn't a person whom I identified with. I wrestled with this for a while growing up, and many other children in this position do as well.

At SON Ministries, I see the children genuinely laughing, forming friendships, and trying new things that are outside of their comfort zones. They challenge each other, and they show their love for each other unapologetically. At SON Ministries, neither the money or cultural barriers burden these children's hearts. People serve each other out of respect and love, not out of pity.

I have always been pretty independent, and I started saving my money since the fourth grade. Later on, the money from summer jobs, birthdays, and babysitting added onto it, and it became my own little college fund that I never had. It really wasn't all that much, but it comforted me to just have it exist under my control.

Finally going through the college application process and senior year in general, I have seen just how much Jesus had been providing for me all of my life. Not just circumstantially and financially, but in terms of investing in me, protecting me, and loving me unconditionally.

I'm so blessed to be attending my dream college this fall, and if I work consistently throughout

the year, the tuition and fees are manageable. Gradually, I discovered that I didn't want any other source of solace and comfort other than my God. I hope to live that way in the future, and for now, I want my (entire) savings \$5,707.43 to go where I've heard His voice speaking so clearly: SON Ministries.

With SON Ministries, I've fallen in love with service itself. I think that we sometimes misconstrue the meaning of service with a feeling of self-pride or even pity (or you know, those volunteer hours), but SON Ministries has clearly shown me that service means to be a servant of God, and therefore a servant of His children at SON Ministries.

I respect those at SON Ministries because of their courage and talents; I do not pity the families we serve because they have nothing to be pitied for. They are as loved as I am, have their own families that they care for, and are individual minds with enormous strengths.

This connection to the act of service reminds me to be sincerely humble and to act out of passion instead of obligation in everything that I do.


